#### A Review of the Team for 2013

The winter of 2012/13 saw Darlington look to improve on the runners up position in the North Yorkshire and South Durham Premier League in 2012 by bring in four new players in the close season.

Each one of them brought something new to the side and it was hoped they would all contribute to us going one place better in 2013.

The new players were; John Watson a steady opening batsman with a pedigree in the NEPL and Durham Senior League with Norton. He has fulfilled his promise with over 650 runs in league and cup this season, over 450 in the league. His friend from Norton, the 21 year old Harry Linton also joined us and has also proved a success mostly as a middle order batsman and exceptional fielder. He has scored over 200 league runs and 11 catches. The third of the four newcomers was Ben Wicling, a left handed opener with an attacking streak to his batting. A teacher at Barnard castle prep School Ben also coached Liam Coates and James Dobson at Durham CCC. With over 400 league runs including a maiden NYSD Premier century at Hartlepool, Ben has also proved his worth to the team.

The final newbie was the much experienced ex captain of Marton, Matthew Brown. An exceptional all rounder who also had a spell with Richmondshire, "Brownie" made a late start to the season due to a serious back operation

He soon laid his marker down with some match winning performances. He finished the season with well over 350 runs and an impressive average. He also bowled some vital spells for the side and was an excellent slip fielder.

Added to these four new players were the nucleus of last season's team.

Liam Coates continued to bat at three and scored over 700 runs in all cricket and over 450 in league games. He also bowled well when called on by his captain. His fielding was again top draw.

With Brown at 4, the wicket keeper, James Dobson batted at 5 or 6. Dobson scored over runs with some vital knocks to "finish" games off when we were chasing a score. His wicket keeping was even better than last year, vital stumpings changing the course of games. Harry Linton proved on several occasions what an important middle order player he was plating some really important knocks for the team.

Linton would bat at 5 or 6 followed by the two professionals, Barnes and Mulholland. Barnes' ability to judge the game situation and his knowledge of adapting his style to suit a variation of wickets was invaluable.

Mulholland was the cup specialist batsman scoring 332 cup runs. Doug didn't manage to transfer his cup success to league matches and with the top order doing well his opportunities were limited. Lee Craggs would bat after this if and when needed. Lee didn't get many opportunities over the season but was an ever willing member of the side and was outstanding in the field taking more outfield catches than anyone else

We would have a floating player on a rotation basis from the second team as a 9 or 10 batsman. Several players did the job but the role fell to Callum Lethbridge towards the end of the season and he never let the side down once. Finally the skipper himself, Peter Armstrong would be the official number 11 although on certain occasions he would come to the crease a little earlier to power hit for the side!

The success of the side was also through the incredible bowling skills of the five main bowlers we used over the season.

Both Coates and Brown would have been main bowlers in any other team, it was the fact that the other three were just so good that limited their opportunities with the ball.

A look at the team averages will reveal the incredible season the three main bowlers had.

Another reason for our success was the vast improvement in athleticism in the field and the improvement meant dropped catches were few and far between.

All in all the team looked as strong as any of the top four or five in the league this year and the experience gained from winning a final and losing a final and finishing runners up once again will only help the side grow stronger for next season.

The captain's success rate at the toss was also improved. At one point he went 7 games on the trot winning the toss. We won twice as many tosses as we lost.

As a team we scored 3183 runs and conceded 3130 runs.

We took 193 wickets and only lost our own wickets 130 times.

We bowled 4 teams out for less than a 100 and took all ten wickets on 12 occasions. In contrast we were only bowled out 3 times over the season.

We used 19 different players in the season. 8 of those were rotational players from the second eleven.

Coates, Mulholland, Barnes and Armstrong never missed a game.

Our Scorer, David Piper should be congratulated as an ever present and Mrs Mulholland with her wonderful teas kept her high standards going throughout the season with her culinary best. Even Paul Hollywood would have been impressed with her cakes. Mr. Bean and Mr. Dunstone were ever presence at home games selling the programmes and they raised a good amount for the club through their efforts.

The groundsman provided excellent cricket wickets that suited our side and thankfully the weather was kind for most of the season.

Finally the supporters who came and watched enjoyed the standard so much many regularly came to away games too.
