The fact that he continued to keep even when Andy Fothergill returned from his 1st class wicket keeping career in 1993 is testament to his undoubted abilities and his place in the long line of terrific wicket keepers the club has had in its history.

The Next Ten Years – 2001 to 2011

The youth programme begins to pay off

The next ten seasons were to see the fruition of the efforts of the coaches who introduced coaching to the club.

Numerous youngsters went through the system. Not all stayed at the club; some went to Darlington RA, others to District League clubs. Others stayed until University and disappeared through work once they had graduated.

However – several young players went through the system and progressed through the senior teams to help the club develop their own home grown talent.

Many other NYSD league clubs attracted young players from other clubs by varying means instead of creating their own youth programme. Darlington's system became the envy of many and provided a conveyor belt of talent in the next decade. The junior teams all did well in their respective leagues and cup competitions and invariably presentation nights involved many cup and trophy awards for championships and cups won!
